### Creating the club website

Soon after the Bellarine Mac User Group got underway it became quite obvious that a web site for the club would be essential. Without such a site we would not be able to register with Apple and thus be unable to become recognised as an official Apple/Mac user group as well as missing out on the many other advantages that registration brought with it.

The question became...

how do we get a site up and running quickly and inexpensively to allow us to get the registration ball rolling whilst giving ourselves time to make all the correct decisions?

And the answer was to apply for some free internet space (5MB) from Yahoo/Geocities and produce a "rough" site using iWeb, which is part of the current iLife suite of applications.

Nobody on the committee had used iWeb to any great extent up to that time, thus the process of creating a site became a quite steep learning curve for those involved. Along the way we were also to learn that iWeb had more than a few shortcomings (hopefully many of these will be addressed when Version 2.0 is released).

At one stage we began to investigate the possibility of using some other web creation tool such as *RapidWeaver*, but it was decided to persevere with iWeb because it was an Apple application and readily available, albeit at a cost, to all Mac users. It was felt that using an 'in house' application would enable others to pickup the threads later on if necessary and enable them to continue to administer and update the site into the future.

Hence, a very simple 2 page BMUG 1 site was constructed and uploaded to Geocities. This arrangement did not allow for any email facility for the group and a temporary email address was set up using a committee member's own ISP.

The design and colour scheme of the site came about almost accidentally but from the outset it was felt desirable to have a readily recognisable Bellarine Peninsula item incorporated somewhere, hence the Barwon Heads Bridge.

We hope to add more local pictures further down the track and hope to maintain and expand the seaside feel of the site.

BMUG asked Cliff Benson, one of our members, to design a logo for the group and he was given a blank canvas. In the long run the various shades of teal that Cliff chose for the logo have been incorporated into our colour scheme.

The Steering Committee decided that it would be best for the group to obtain its own domain name, feeling that this appeared greatly more professional to visitors to the site. The advantages of having the designation ".au" included in the domain name were discussed at length and even though having this designation makes the domain name registration cost slightly more, it was decided to proceed and the domain name of bellarinemac.org.au was registered.

Nicholas Pyers, a great supporter of Mac User Groups, made us aware of a completely Mac friendly hosting group in USA called "Itsamac" which offered a very generous 5,000MB completely free hosting package to registered Mac user groups (MUGs). Being painfully aware of the meagre finances of the club we decided to snap up their offer. Wide and flexible email facilities came as part of the free package and this has allowed BMUG to give each committee member their own bellarinemac email address.

Concurrent with all these arrangements being made, construction of a far more complex site of multiple pages was commenced and several "dry runs" and countless revisions were tested and tested again. Our aim was to maintain the "feel" of the original site, which appeared to be quite popular with our members.

Eventually after a few problems with an iCal subscription link and a members' forum page that was only designed to work correctly if the site were published on .Mac it was decided to go ahead without the forum at this stage. It is intended to revisit this decision should the next version of iWeb include a forum capability which supports external hosts.

So finally, the supposedly complete site was uploaded to Itsamac.com using the trusty freeware application "Cyberduck". The URL was circulated to the committee and to a few web experts who on the whole came up with much valuable input. But bear in mind this site is, and will remain a work in progress and your committee would warmly welcome and carefully consider any suggestions members may have for improvements.

We hope you enjoy the BMUG web site and suggest that you may like to add it to you favourites bookmarks list. It has been a lot of work to set it up but the gaining of a greater knowledge of the workings of the World Wide Web has offset this. Over time you will see improvements and additions to the site, we ask you to check it often for the latest news from BMUG and beyond and hope that it will assist you in the enjoyment of your BMUG membership and your Mac.
